**Bakersfield, Calif. (Thursday, June 5, 2025)** – The <u>Greater Bakersfield Chamber</u> will celebrate the 35th Annual <u>Beautiful Bakersfield Awards</u>, presented by <u>Valley Strong Credit Union</u>, honoring the people, organizations and businesses working to create a better Bakersfield.
